Outer View

Image 1

This image was entered in the End of Year Creative Section. The image has failed to impress any Judge and the End of Year Judges were no exception. To do better you have to be an astronaut with a camera.

This experimental image was conceived on an evening sunset photography shoot near Heskett at the back of Mount Macedon last year.

Shooting the sunset I noted the interesting reflections of the sunset on the windscreen of my Subaru - see image below.

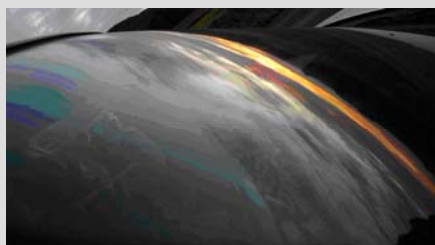

You can see from Image 2 the curvature of the windscreen and the sunset and it only required some imagination to realise that this had possibilities of giving the appearance of an outer space photo if manipulated & darkened and cropped for effect.

The two remaining photos of the moon and the model space station have a story too.

The moon was shot with an old Nikon F3 film camera with a 2 times teleconverter on a 500 mm mirror lens. This was a historic set of moon photos that were digitised and manipulated to brighten and make the exposure more even.

The space station model took the longest as I had to learn to use my eldest

son's 3D engineering modelling program. Initially I looked up NASA and saw that the current space station was as complicated as a big metallic bowl of spaghetti and I would be working for a year to model the current station accurately.

Hence the simplified model view below. It took a long time with lots of experiments to shift the view with the lighting source that looked appropriate when merged into the windscreens image. The image of the moon and the space station were merged into the dark black areas of the principal sunset image, cleaned, resized to 1024x768 plus the exposure fix and a small amount of sharpening for final assessment in my BenQ digital projector.



The Alan Elliott Perpetual Trophy for Photo-Journalism EDI



John Franceschini of Sharp and Howells, Allan Elliott's employer prior to his retirement, expressed a desire to donate a trophy to recognize Alan's long contribution to chemical industry and to photography.

The Melbourne Camera Club Board of Directors approved the idea and that it be for photojournalism EDI due to Allan's long interest in PJ.

Ian Bock, who has organised the production of our trophies for over 30 years, volunteered to obtain a trophy and suggested it include perhaps the most significant camera used by photo-journalists - the original Nikon F.

Our current trophy manufacturer agreed to make a stand with 22 shields for future award winners and able to support a camera.

Ian was able to acquire a very nice Nikon F with Photonic head for the trophy. While the camera is in good condition but showing definite signs of being well used, the shutter mechanism is jammed and repair is not economic or feasible. However it is the ideal camera for its purpose.

This trophy must be returned to the club to be awarded in the following year. The winner each year also receives a plaque which they retain.

The inaugural recipient of the Allan Elliott trophy for PJ EDI is Steve Spencer.

The role of a judge is an interesting one but not one that I always relish.

I like looking at others' images but one of the more difficult jobs I have done is in judging folios for school students.

It is relatively easy if the criteria for judging is technical – focus, exposure, print quality, etc. and even composition but a good part of a final quality/appeal of a photo is the

message that the viewer/judge receives. In school photos quite a few dark/Gothic images occur and I'm afraid I don't always get the message. This is where I was when judging for the Bockey this year.

How do I determine what photo gave a photographer most fun - most enjoyment in its production?

One contender was a water drop landing on a water surface, the skill, the fun is taking the photo - or more

correctly many photos until an acceptable one was achieved -- I've been there, done that except with smoke rising from incense stick.

My final choice however was "Vampire" by Ian Holdsworth.

But my problem was I did not like it! Ian would have enjoyed working on the idea, then taking several photos and finally merging them together in the computer.

This raises a last point in judging - a judge must, as much as possible, put aside any personal bias and look at the objectives of a competition to select the image that best fits them.

When I announced the award, I mentioned I did not like the image - when I gave the award to Ian he admitted he did not like much either but enjoyed making it.

Perhaps he likes it better now!



iPhone Photography

Lee Harvey put on a very impressive presentation of his style of iPhone alternative photography at an informal club night on 19 January.

Lee is obviously an experienced photographer and, as he said, in coming to Australia he downsized his cameras and learnt to use the iPhone (with iPad) and also a G9 and recently a C100 camera.

He uses the Hipstamatic lens app for the iPhone (2010 iPhone app of the year), which "brings back the look, feel, unpredictable beauty, and fun of plastic toy cameras from the past" (see www.hipstamatic.com). Lee also presented images of his travels from Canada to Australia - "Ice roads to nice roads". It is such a pity that Lee and Christine are not staying longer.

Three examples are given here. On the left *Ocean Tumblers* received a Highly Commended in the nature section. And the two on the right are examples of the kind of images that the app for the iPhone will produce.
